


Daily routines

Toilets are next to the classroom.



5 R’s and how children will Thrive in your class

Respect, Resilience, Resourcefulness, Reciprocity and Reflection are the foundations on which our school is built. Children will learn these words and what they mean so that they can be the best version of themselves. We are allowed to make mistakes in RG- even the grown-ups sometimes! We work together to put things right and we never, ever give up. We keep our classroom tidy and organized so that we know where things are and to keep us all safe. Children will know where our Happy Box is if they need extra comfort and our class puppet is always around for a cuddle. We have short mindfulness sessions each day for children to Reflect on their day and to settle down, ready to work.


